SUNDERLAND SELECT BOARD

Regular Meeting - July 17, 2017

- 1. Call to order by Mark Hyde
- 2. Board members present
 - a. Rick Timmerman, Jon French, Mark Hyde, and Steven Bendix
 - b. Audience
 - Rose Keough (Town Secretary/Treasurer), Marc Johnston (Highway Foreman), Jack Kelliher (S&R Corporation), Mark Mackintosh (VTrans), Peter Van Vleck, John Stuermer, Mike Perra, Judith Ackerhalt, Michael Godgikian, Timothy Ryan, Charles Moffitt, Gloria Moffitt
- 3. Session recorded by GNAT-TV
- 4. Approval of Minutes from June 23, 2017
 - a. Motion made to approve the previous meeting minutes from June 23,2017 made by French, seconded by Timmerman, motion passed
- 5. Report from Road Liaison and/or Highway Foreman
 - a. Sunderland Hill Road closure for Railroad bridge replacement Jack Kelliher (S&R Corp.) and Mark Mackintosh (VTrans)
 - i. Would like to expand the road for safety, would need road closure
 - 1. The board has decided that this closure will not work
 - ii. Would like to shut down the road for 10 days (Sept 9/10 to Sept 19/20 for demolition)
 - 1. They need a crane to get bridge supports in place
 - iii. Open for public discussion

- Peter Van Vleck commented that he had wished that he, and others near the construction, had been warned at least by letter from the state before the construction began
 - A. He would like to make sure traffic doesn't turn around in his driveway
 - He would like to make sure that contact is made with emergency response in surrounding towns to make them aware of road closure
 - c. He also said the noise is very loud and causes,
 among other things, sleep disruption
 - other neighbors say they too have been bothered by the noise
- 2. Hyde asked what kind of barrier would be constructed
 - Type 3 barrier would be used at both ends, potentially with a staggered patterned in between to allow affected residents to enter and exit
- John Stuermer commented that the traffic on North Road and Borough Road will be horrendous, and suggested a temporary speed bump put in at the stop sign at the bottom of North Road to slow down traffic
- 4. Peter Van Vleck commented that over 500 vehicles per day were found to have crossed on Sunderland Hill Road in that area in a prior traffic study
- 5. Johnston asked Jack Kelliher if he will assist with chloride on the dirt road once travel across it is complete
- 6. French commented that he will ask for more patrols in the area to help cut down on speeders
- Discussion of where signs will be place on the north side of the closure

- a. Consensus was made that they should be placed near Muddy Lane to aid in diversion of traffic
- In response to inquiry/complaint regarding the noise and disruption caused by the construction, Jack Kelliher commented that there should only be one more day of 24 hour work
 - a. However, during the proposed 10 day road closure, they are scheduled for 24 hour work days, which hopefully won't be necessary
 - The construction typically only shuts down due to lightning
- 9. John Stuermer asked about damage to roads
 - Jack Kelliher responded that their heavy equipment have steel plates to ensure even weight distribution across the road, limiting road damage
- 10. John Stuermer asked about state statute limiting working hours, Jack Kelliher said that his contract reads that he's allowed to work beyond it
- 11. Motion made by French to close Sunderland Hill Road during the days of September 9, 2017, through September 19, 2017, seconded by Timmerman, motion passed
- b. North Road closure for bridge replacement
 - Project will be rescheduled for next year due to concerns over timeline
- c. Covered Bridge warning signs seem to be working, the brush has been trimmed around the sign going north near the antique store
- 6. Old Business
 - a. Parcel mapping contract discussion/approval
 - Tabled for now

7. New Business

- a. Kelley Stand speed limit discussion/planning Timothy Ryan
 - Timothy Ryan had originally started a petition to lower the speed limit on Kelley Stand
 - ii. Mr. Ryan expressed concern over the difference in speed limit between upper and lower speed limit is confusing
 - iii. Hyde replied that in order to change the speed limit on the road to enable concurrent enforcement, a road study would need to be done
 - Mr. Ryan asked if knew how much it would cost, Hyde does not
 - iv. Hyde continued to give the other option of changing the speed limit signs after adopting a new ordinance, with enforcement not technically taking effect for five years
 - v. Mr. Ryan replied that he believes that the change in signs without a road study would be sufficient, understanding that the changed speed limit would not be enforceable for five years
 - vi. Michael Godgikian, Judith Acherhalt, Gloria Moffitt, and Charles

 Moffitt all told of incidents where people almost got in accidents in

 front of their houses or their neighbors'
 - vii. Johnston will work on the 3-4 speed limit signs
 - viii. Gloria Moffitt brought up the idea of putting up "sharp corner/turn" signs ******
 - 1. Johnston will look into where potential signage would go

- ix. French will work on revising the ordinance
- x. Mrs. Moffitt asked how long the process would take, Hyde said his estimate is that the signs could be changed sometime in the fall
- b. Disability Rights report of the Town Hall
 - i. Doors need to be adjusted so that they are not as hard to open
 - 1. Johnston will be able to accomplish before next vote
- c. Unlicensed Dogs and Animal Control Warrant
 - i. No valid motion made
- 8. Review of Bills, Correspondence, and Signing of Select Board's Orders
 - a. Storm water grant funding opportunity
 - i. We are not ready to pursue at this time
 - b. On Monday, July 24, 2017 there will be a Sunderland Town Clerk Board of Civil Authority at the Sunderland Town Hall at 6:00 pm for grievance hearings
 - i. All Select Board members will attend
 - c. Haskins Oil has given us a pre-buy option at \$1.299 a gallon for 2400 gallons, for a total of \$3117.60
 - i. With our credit carried over, there will be a balance of \$2890.96
 - ii. Motion made by Bendix to sign the contract agreeing to above Haskins oil pre-buy, seconded by Timmerman, motion passed
 - d. Fire Warden re-appointment request from the state
 - French made a motion to appoint Paul Ennis, Sr to Fire Warden,
 Timmerman seconded, motion passed
 - e. VLCT refund

- VLCT would like animal control to be classified under payroll for insurance reasons, however because this does not work for our situation, it will remain as is
- f. Generator inspection was done by Mr. Brophy, the report is good
- g. Missy Johnson feels like she hasn't had much progress with her push back with residents on the Junk Ordinance; however, the Select Board feels that those residents contacted have made significant progress
- 9. Motion to adjourn made by French, seconded by Hyde, motion passed
