# Regular Meeting - 3.12.18

- 1. Call to order by Mark Hyde
- 2. Board members present
  - a. Rick Timmerman, Jon French, Mark Hyde, Steven Bendix, and Melanie
    Virgilio
  - b. Audience
    - i. Marc Johnston (Road Foreman), Rose Keough (Town Clerk/Treasurer)

- 4. Organization of Select Board
  - Motion made by Bendix to nominate Hyde to Select Board chair, seconded by French, motion passed
  - Motion made by Timmerman to nominate French to clerk of the Select
    Board, seconded by Bendix, motion passed
  - c. Motion made by French to nominate Timmerman to road liaison of Select Board, seconded by Bendix, motion passed
  - d. Motion made by French to nominate Bendix to ISWAP/SWIP liaison, seconded by Timmerman, motion passed
  - e. Motion made by Bendix to nominate French to insurance liaison, seconded by Virgilio, motion passed
  - f. Motion made by French to nominate Virgilio to Green Up liaison, seconded by Timmerman, motion passed
  - g. Motion made by Bendix to nominate French to police liaison, seconded by Timmerman, motion passed
  - h. Motion made by Timmerman to nominate Stephanie Muñoz Wells to secretary, seconded by French, motion passed
- 5. Approval of Minutes from March 5, 2018 meeting

- a. Motion made to approve the previous meeting minutes made by French, seconded by Bendix, motion passed
- 6. Report from Road Liaison and/or Highway Foreman
  - a. Johnston relayed that all equipment is running, and preparations have been made for the upcoming storm(s)

## b. Budget

- i. Hyde pointed out that the town is about at the equipment budget already, due to multiple breakdowns of the red truck
  - The repairs on the red truck for this year has been over \$16,000
  - 2. The new plow truck won't be ready until around September
- ii. Johnston relayed that the cost of radios did go over budget about \$100
- c. Better Backroads Category A Grant received for \$6,390 (80/20 match)
  - This will be used to put together a plan for preventing erosions,
    which will be submitted to the state
  - ii. Fitzgerald will create the plan for \$8,200, Town of Sunderland will make up the rest
  - iii. Motion made by Timmerman to approve the erosion plan to be performed by Fitzgerald, seconded by French, motion passed

### 7. New Business

- a. Speed control
  - i. Hyde mentioned possibly installing a speedometer to similar to those that are in Manchester, they can be moved as necessary
  - ii. Many complaints have been made of speeding vehicles on South Road and North Road
  - iii. Virgilio mentioned that much of North Road, in particular, is shaded

- Timmerman and Johnston relayed that because they are LED lights, they don't need as much solar power to operate, and it doesn't need direct sunlight
- iv. Timmerman mentioned concern of possible vandalism
- v. Virgilio mentioned concern that the speedometers may cause some to speed intentionally, or even race
- vi. Virgilio asked if there are adequate speed limit signs in town
  - 1. Johnston relayed that the town has met the state standard for postage, but we do need to update some to be reflective
- vii. Virgilio asked if it would be possible to rent a unit
  - Timmerman relayed that there are speed carts normally provided by the Sheriff's Department
- viii. Bendix asked French if Sheriff Schmidt has mentioned the effectiveness of the speed carts, the answer was no
- ix. Timmerman will look into pricing again, and the Board will consider it again in June

### b. Appointments

- Newspaper
  - Bendix suggested the News Guide, Keough answered that for legal reasons, notices must be posted in a daily paper, but that the News Guide may be used in tandem
  - Motion made by Timmerman to appoint Bennington Banner as newspaper of record, seconded by French, motion passed
- ii. Hyde suggested keeping Select Board meetings on the first and third Monday of each month at 6:30pm
- iii. Motion made by Bendix to appoint Woolmington, Campbell, Bernal, and Bent to Town legal counsel, seconded by French, motion passed

- iv. Motion made by French to appoint Kerry Olson as animal control officer/pound keeper, seconded by Bendix, motion passed
- v. Motion made by Bendix to appoint Mike DiMonda as emergency management coordinator, seconded by French, motion passed
- vi. Health officer and deputy health officer positions are currently open, please notify the Select Board if interested
  - By default, if there is no health officer, the Select Board acts as the health officer
- vii. Motion made by Bendix to appoint Samuel Liss as service officer, seconded by Virgilio, motion passed
- viii. Tree warden position is currently open, please notify the Select Board if interested
  - By default, if there is no tree warden, the Select Board acts as the tree warden
- ix. Motion made by French to appoint Mark Hyde to webmaster, seconded by Bendix, motion passed
- x. Motion made by French to appoint Missy Johnson to zoning administrator, seconded by Timmerman, motion passed
- xi. A Planning Board position is currently open, please notify the Select Board if interested
- xii. Zoning Board
  - Motion made by French to appoint Peter Van Vleck, Jr. to a three year Zoning Board position, seconded by Bendix, motion passed
  - Motion made by Timmerman to appoint Robert Alexander to a two year Zoning Boarding position, seconded by French, motion passed
- xiii. BCRC positions currently filled

- xiv. Other open positions include auditor (3) and lister (2), please contact the Select Board with any interest
  - Keough is meeting with a gentleman interested in an auditor position
    - Keough said that there should be three auditors, but that with one, at least the accounts can be reconciled by someone other than her
  - Keough and Hyde will post the elected open positions to three public places, and the website
- xv. Motion made by French to appoint John Williams to the new position of community service request liaison, seconded by Bendix, motion passed
- c. Timmerman mentioned that there has been a problem getting salt (American Rock Salt), because there was a 200 ton salt limit in the contract, the price will need to be renegotiated
  - i. Cargill has informed us that they are no longer able to deliver salt
    - 1. This contract limit has not been reached due to their inability to deliver
  - ii. Timmerman will review the contract(s) and look into further, and report back
- d. Act 250 request from the Battenkill Inn
  - i. Hyde will tell Missy Johnson that she can fill out the necessary paperwork
- e. Arlington Area Renewal Project
  - i. Asking for Sunderland representative for SWOT
  - ii. The group's purpose is to identify strengths, weaknesses, and threats in the Arlington area, and result from the SWOT analysis will guide the plan for the renewal project

- iii. They would like a Select Board member to be present March 23rd and 24th
- f. There will be a rabies clinic in Arlington on Saturday, March 24th at the East Arlington Fire House from 10am-2pm
  - Keough will contact those will expiring rabies contracts and she will be present to issue licenses
- g. Motion made by French to grant Rose Keough authority to open all mail received, seconded by Virgilio, motion passed
