1. Call to order

The chair called the meeting to order.

2. Roll call

Eric Hatch took role. A quorum of the board was not present

## 3. Conflict of interest

#### 7. Announcements

Tim Scoggins reported that CCI trucks were spotted in Shaftsbury laying fiber.

Eric Hatch reported that the executive committee has a standing meeting with CCI every week and they're moving forward on a universal service plan and buildout plans. One of the items being worked on with CCI is data analysis, and the CUD has been tasked with ground truthing certain identified addresses to confirm whether they are served or not. This may involve board members doing outreach to the addresses in their town. CCI is beginning to lay fiber under its RDOF commitment and will be covering an additional 200 addresses that would have been included in the CUD's territory. In total they will be providing fiber to about 1400 homes. The CUD and CCI plan to announce all of this publicly soon. The CUD will also need to decide what's going to happen with its towns that are in more than one CUD. Eric will be giving an interview to VTDigger about the CUD's public/private partnership and testifying before the House Energy & Technology Committee.

## 8. Treasurer's Report

Al Bashevkin gave an overview of the CUD's YTD financials and March spending. The CUD received the first half of it's H.315 funds which enabled it to make several outstanding payments.

#### 10. Other business

Winhall is considering forming a new tri-mountain CUD that could include a handful of towns. If a new CUD is formed, it will not be eligible for Act 71 funding. Fred Schwacke gave an overview of why Winhall is considering the formation of a new CUD: Winhall is towards the end of the CUD's buildout schedule, and the Town is uncomfortable with the idea of giving public money to a private corporation and wants to have more control in the deployment of broadband in their area. There will be a public forum to discuss the formation of a tri-mountain CUD in Winhall on April 28<sup>th</sup>. Eric Hatch said the CUD's goal is still to get 90% of its district (including Winhall and Londonderry) built out in the next 12-18 months.
