Jeff Dexter reporterd that he has been in contact with consultants regarding town hall property and wetlands restrictions. Jeff Dexter also requested a 1 time grant of \$500 from ARPA funds to finance window inserts for residents who would have difficulty with the cost.

Jeff also volunteered to work with Bruce Matteson on a potential yard clean-up project.

A discussion of a rental tax on short term rentals occurred. It seems that the Planning Board has rejected the idea.

In follow-up to a suggestion from a resident at a recent Select Board meeting, Alex shared that the VODEC grant application window is closed and it seems that the grant criteria do not fit the project.

The Planning Board has recommended the purchase and installation of 5 "Welcome to Sunderland" signs. ARPA funds will be requested for the purchase of these signs.
